

JN7 University College of Engineering - Kakinada Scholarships

n the third year of the program, 15 second year students shortlisted by the college committee on economic grounds were approved for the financial aid. With 15 students of present third and fourth years already receiving the scholarships, the total candidates under the program is 30. KEATS thanks ECOSAK and it's Hyderabad chapter for pledging Rs 1.00 lakh each every year by which 10 candidates can be supported.



In addition, for the second year our Advisor and CEO of AVANTEL Ltd Dr Abburi Vidyasagar is sponsoring 13 girl students this year alone. With 8 girls of earlier batches, the total is 21. The scholarships based on merit-cum-means is facilitated through LAKSHMEE FOUNDATION TRUST. The overall tally thus is 51 students for 2024-25. Each student will be receiving an amount of Rs 20,000 per annum. These scholarships were disbursed on 7th January 2025 at the college in

the presence of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof KVSG Murali Krishna, Principal Prof N Mohanrao, Vice-principal Dr M Swarupa Rani and other dignitaries. Mr Ramesh Kosaraju and Mr Sampath Myneni represented KEATS and LAKSHMEE FOUNDATION respectively. Local KEATS members Mr MV Rajarao and Dr I Santhiprabha were also present.

their efforts are focused in providing an environment that will help her recover from the traumatic effects of victimization and develop an understanding of herself and awareness of the dynamics of domestic violence, relationships, financial and workplace requirements through rehabilitation skill trainings and counselling.



Giving back to Societyprior to inception of KEATS

Giving back to the Society started with very small donations from friends and their children who used to celebrate their birthdays, marriage days with school children by distribution of sweets, fruits, books etc. Mr Krishna Mohan Rao Mullapudi used to regularly organise in the Schools around Tiruvuru prior to inception of KEATS. It is no exaggeration if we consider him as the inspiration behind the very idea of formation of KEATS.



Computer Education in ZPH Schools in Krishna Dist. AP



This is one of the early projects undertaken by KEATS after its formation. As many as 35 schools in Krishna district were selected and trainers recruited. The initial enthusiasm by the school managements melted slowly forcing us to discontinue the programme.

Infrastructure development at ZPH School, Tiruvoor-Krishna Dt, AP

nfrastructure Development included benches to the students, toilets along with continuous water supply for boys and girls, stage for daily assembly and for conducting Annual Days. English speaking courses were conducted periodically to build confidence among the students to face the challenges in life.

Dilapidated classrooms were demolished and new block along with toilets were constructed. Computer lab, digital class rooms and drinking water facility were provided. A library/reading room was established in the village community hall to help youth prepare for exams.

The society run by Mr Ayikaraju and his spouse takes care of AIDS affected children. An exigency block for critically ill children and toilet block for girl inmates were constructed and financial support provided during Covid time. KEATS USA is providing financial support as and when needed.

Anganwadi Center/School improvement at Bombay Tanda

Dombay Tanda is a tribal village near Illendu of Bhadrachalam Kothagudem district in Telangana State. An anganwadi center and primary school were renovated by providing benches, drinking water and facelift to the buildings.



Open Defecation Free Project at Bombay Tanda



onstruction of Toilet cum Bath rooms for each and every household of tribal hamlet having around 250 families was undertaken. It resulted in dignity to women and health benefits to all the people. This Tanda was declared Open defecation free (ODF) by Sri Raju IG of CRPF. This is one of the projects that has given us immense satisfaction.

Vivekananda Convent High School, Moosapet, Hyderabad

This convent with reasonable standards of education caters to the children of labourers and lower income group. Fee reimbursement (partially and fully) was provided to poor students and financial assistance was given for other facilities. During Covid time, salaries of staff were taken care of.



Support to Alambana -School for poor children



Alambana School in Kukatpally provides free education to children of migrant labourers. We have provided timely assistance in running the school.

Skill Development Project, Gurukulam - Tadepalligudem

Skill Development training was given on Modern Survey using DGPS and Testing of Construction Material for 40 days which was well taken by students. They were also placed after the training. Late Sri T Ch Hanuman Rao took this initiative and camped there through out.



Support to Orphan girls of Kasturba Gandhi National Memorial Trust





Covid Relief Activities

To provide succour & strength to vulnerable sections during the lockdown crisis, KEATS stepped in to do it's best.

- 1. Support to orphanages, migrant labour, homeguards, police personnel on duty, hairdressers, cab drivers etc
- 2. 500 provision kits were distributed to Municipal workers on daily wages through Mrs Kavya Kishan Reddy.
- 3. Nearly 1,000 kits were distributed in remote tribal villages of Khammam and Kothagudem dts.
- 4. Another 1,000 kits were given to carpenters from Rajasthan, labourers from West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh and Bihar, ASHA and sanitary workers and needy archakas.
- 5. PPE kits and equipment were given to Gandhi and Osmania Medical College Hospitals.



Donation to Kerala Flood Victims




